This week the flowers at the Altar are given to the Glory of God and in loving memory of L.A.L. Colin T. Arthur and L.A.L. Claude M Ross, two Australian Airmen who crashed in Nottawasaga Bay February 4th 1941.

On this day February 4th in the year 1941 two young Australian Airmen lost their lives when their yellow Harvard #2704 crashed through the ice on Nottawasaga Bay during a training exercise from the airbase at Camp Borden L.A.A.C Colin Tolhurst Arthur, 23 years of age, from Mount Gambier, South Australia, and L.A.C Claude Murray Ross, who was only 19 years old from Melbourne, were in Canada together with over one thousand other young Australians under the British Commonwealth Air Training Programme. Although the remains of the aircraft were recovered in the spring of that year the bodies of the airmen were never found.

As a lasting memorial to these two young men, their parents erected the stained glass memorial windows of St Michael and St George that are at the north end of the west wall of the Church. In his letter to the Australian Liaison Office, Air Vice-Marshal S.J. Goble, at the time that the windows were unveiled and dedicated, The Reverend Bill Kibblewhite stated that “In a sense the windows will be a perpetual reminder of all the Australian boys who came here to train...” And so it is that the Australian Government considers these windows a memorial to all Australians who trained under this programme and particularly the 160 airmen who lost their lives during this period of training. It is for this reason that the Australian Air Force Ensign placed between these windows by the Australian high Commissioner, Sir William Glasgow in 1944 continues to hang there today.

Each year since that time we at All Saints’, Collingwood, with gratitude and thanksgiving, remember these two young men and their comrades who lost their lives as they sought to defend that way of life that allows us to continue to love and worship as we do today.


