Reading for the day

John 1:1-18 - In the beginning was the Word, and the Word was with God, and the Word was God. He was in the beginning with God. All things came into being through him, and without him not one thing came into being. What has come into being 4 in him was life, and the life was the light of all people. The light shines in the darkness, and the darkness did not overcome it. There was a man sent from God, whose name was John. He came as a witness to testify to the light, so that all might believe through him. He himself was not the light, but he came to testify to the light. The true light, which enlightens everyone, was coming into the world. He was in the world, and the world came into being through him; yet the world did not know him. He came to what was his own, and his own people did not accept him. But to all who received him, who believed in his name, he gave power to become children of God, who were born, not of blood or of the will of the flesh or of the will of man, but of God. And the Word became flesh and lived among us, and we have seen his glory, the glory as of a father's only son, full of grace and truth. (John testified to him and cried out, "This was he of whom I said, 'He who comes after me ranks ahead of me because he

was before me."') From his fullness we have all received, grace upon grace. The law indeed was given through Moses; grace and truth came through Jesus Christ. No one has ever seen God. It is God the only Son, who is close to the Father's heart, who has made him known.

Refrain

The statutes of the Lord rejoice the heart.

The heavens declare the glory of God, and the firmament shows his handiwork. One day tells its tale to another, and one night imparts knowledge to another. Although they have no words or language, and their voices are not heard, Their sound has gone out into all lands, and their message to the ends of the world. In the deep has he set a pavilion for the sun; it comes forth like a bridegroom out of his chamber; it rejoices like a champion to run its course. It goes forth from the uttermost edge of the heavens and runs about to the end of it again; nothing is hidden from its burning heat. The law of the Lord is perfect and revives the soul; the testimony of the Lord is sure and gives wisdom to the innocent. The statutes of the Lord are just and rejoice the heart; the commandment of the Lord is clear and gives light to the eyes. The fear of the Lord is clean and endures for ever; the judgements of the Lord are true and righteous altogether. More to be desired are they than gold, more than much fine gold, sweeter far than honey, than honey in the comb. By them also is your servant enlightened, and in keeping them there is great reward. Who can tell how often he offends? cleanse me from my secret faults. Above all, keep your servant from presumptuous sins; let them not get dominion over me; then shall I be whole and sound, and innocent of a great offence. Let the words of my mouth and the meditation of my heart be acceptable in your sight, O Lord, my strength and my redeemer. R

In his update to the province on Monday 8th June 2020, Premier Doug Ford authorized places of worship to open from this Friday 12th June. While it is good to know that we may now legally open our church buildings for worship, our first priority must remain the welfare of our community.

The Anglican Diocese of Toronto, in partnership with the wider church, is working on a set of guidelines and protocols for all parishes, so that our worship can be shared in a way that is both responsible and safe.

Until those guidelines are published, and until our parish has been able to properly implement them, All Saints' will not be opening for public worship.

We are all eager to be with one another again, and perhaps we now will be sooner rather than later. As we continue to prepare for that day, we will continue to share new information as it is made available to us.

Take Paul's words in Romans 12:12 to heart: Be joyful in hope, patient in affliction, faithful in prayer.

CEMETERY UPDATE

At its AGM on Friday May 22nd, the Board, following a review of prices charged by Collingwood's five other cemeteries, decided to raise our service fees. As of Wednesday July 1st, the price of a single plot will rise from \$850 to \$1,000. Corner Markers, which are required for each ownership, will go up to \$400 per set. The Cemetery continues to struggle financially as plot sales are quite low. The Cemetery Board expresses its gratitude for donations of some \$1,710 used to assist with the cost of removing a diseased Ash tree. In addition, despite Vestry approval to move our Perpetual Care funds from the Diocese to RBC Dominion, this is proving to be problematical and will probably not occur and thus we will continue reduced yield. Our new Bylaws are currently under review by the Bereavement Authority of Ontario. The possible sale of part of our Surplus Lands to Home Horizons is as of Tuesday, very much on the back burner.
