First Reading

Deuteronomy 8:7-18 - For the Lord your God is bringing you into a good land, a land with flowing streams, with springs and underground waters welling up in valleys and hills, a land of wheat and barley, of vines and fig trees and pomegranates, a land of olive trees and honey, a land where you may eat bread without scarcity, where you will lack nothing, a land

whose stones are iron and from whose hills you may mine copper. You shall eat your fill and bless the Lord your God for the good land that he has given you. Take care that you do not forget the Lord your God, by failing to keep his commandments, his ordinances, and his statutes, which I am commanding you today. When you have eaten your fill and have built fine houses and live in them, and when your herds and flocks have multiplied, and your silver and gold is multiplied, and all that you have is multiplied, then do not exalt yourself, forgetting the Lord your God, who brought you out of the land of Egypt, out of the house of slavery, who led you through the great and terrible wilderness, an arid wasteland with poisonous snakes and scorpions. He made water flow for you from flint rock, and fed you in the wilderness with manna that your ancestors did not know, to humble you and to test you, and in the end to do you good. Do not say to yourself, "My power and the might of my own hand have gotten me this wealth." But remember the Lord your God, for it is he who gives you power to get wealth, so that he may confirm his covenant that he swore to your ancestors as he is doing today.

You are to be praised, O God, in Zion; to you shall vows be performed in Jerusalem. To you that hear prayer shall all flesh come, because of their transgressions. Our sins are stronger than we are, but you will blot them out. Happy are they whom you choose and draw to your courts to dwell there! they will be satisfied by the beauty of your house, by the holiness of your temple. Awesome things will you show us in your righteousness, O God of our salvation, O Hope of all the ends of the earth and of the seas that are far away. themselves with flocks, and the valleys cloak themselves with grain;
let them shout for joy and sing. R



“And the feast of harvest, the firstfruits of thy labours which thou hast sown in the field: and the feast of ingathering , [which is] in the end of the year, when thou hast gathered in thy labours out of the field.” (Exodus 23:16)

At Thanksgiving, we understand that harvest time in this scripture from Exodus was also a time to celebrate and give thanks. This is at the very root of our faith history. As we give thanks for the harvest and our work, let us ask ourselves how our food choices might have an impact on creation. Was our food grown in our areas or has it required a lot of transportation to get here? Have farmers been paid a fair price for their crops or are they poor and exploited? Are these fruits and vegetable grown organically, or have they been sprayed with pesticides and chemicals fertilizers?

If these question concerning responsible food are if interest to you, remember it should be local, organic or fair trade. If you would like to sign up for organic baskets of produce, search for Community Supported Agriculture (CSA) in your area.

Please contact the Office to let us know if you will be coming to any of the services listed above. You may use the phone number or email address as noted at the bottom of this page. Please contact the church before 2:30pm the Friday before any Sunday service. A spot will then be reserved for you. For Sunday services, you have until 9:25am to get seated. At that time, available spots will be assigned to those who did not pre-book. This last minute seating will be done on a first come first serve basis.

A list of the names and phone numbers will be forwarded to the Wardens, Father Doug prior to each service. These names will be checked at the services by the sides people on duty. This information is necessary for contact tracing.

An offertory plate will be available at the entrance for donations and envelopes.

Parishioners must wear masks and a few will be available at each service to be worn during the service and then taken home.

A large hand sanitizer dispenser will be placed at the entrance for parishioners' use.

The Order of Service will be displayed on the television screens. No leaflets will be available at the services. However, announcements and related Parish information will be posted on the Church website and included in weekly All Saints' Alive newsletters.

The library, Parish Hall, Upstairs Washrooms, Kitchen will all be out of bounds during Worship Services.

The reopening of the church on Sundays and Wednesdays will be for Worship Services only. At no other times during the week in September will parishioners or the public be permitted in the church building.

Flower Donations to All Saints' Anglican Church, Collingwood Diocese of Toronto Amber Stage October 2020

At this stage of opening we are sadly still unable to accept flower donations for the altar. If you had made prior arrangements for dates in the future you should now have been contacted by the flower co-ordinators, Donna Hurst or Rhuna Sandell.

In the meantime we would like to make a recommendation using an enhanced example that was set by one of our dear parishioners.

- In lieu of flowers, you may consider making a donation to the church.
- A slide will be then be prepared and inserted as a part of the service for the screens in the church and for viewers at home.
- This screen will acknowledge you by name as well as the person you are donating in memory of, or otherwise honouring.
- Your donation will also be noted in the on-line bulletin.
- The donation in lieu of flowers will also be cited by the intercessor on duty during the prayers of the people.
- Of course you may choose to donate but opt to not be acknowledged; however, we truly hope that you do not choose to do this.

This solution represents a beautiful idea for loved ones, does not require florists be given access to the church, nor the required follow-up sanitizing nor the dealing with flowers and vases after the service. Father Doug, the Wardens, the Altar Guild and the flower co-ordinators hope that everyone can embrace this new procedure.


