The Proclamation of the Word

First Reading

Exodus 20:1-4, 7-9, 12-20 - Then God spoke all these words: I am the Lord your God, who brought you out of the land of Egypt, out of the house of slavery; you shall have no other gods before me. You shall not make for yourself an idol, whether in the form of anything that is in heaven above, or that is on the earth beneath, or that is in the water under the earth. You shall not make wrongful use of the name of the

Lord your God, for the Lord will not acquit anyone who misuses his name. Remember the sabbath day, and keep it holy. Six days you shall labour and do all your work. Honour your father and your mother, so that your days may be long in the land that the Lord your God is giving you. You shall not murder. You shall not commit adultery. You shall not steal. You shall not bear false witness against your neighbour. You shall not covet your neighbour's house; you shall not covet your neighbour's wife, or male or female slave, or ox, or donkey, or anything that belongs to neighbour. The statutes of the Lord rejoice the heart.

The heavens declare the glory of God, and the firmament shows his handiwork. One day tells its tale to another, and one night imparts knowledge to another. Although they have no words or language, and their voices are not heard, Their sound has gone out into all lands, and their message to the ends of the world. Second Reading

Philippians 3:4B-14 - If anyone has reason to be confident in the flesh, I have more: circumcised on the eighth day, a member of the people of Israel, of the tribe of Benjamin, a Hebrew born of Hebrews; as to the law, a Pharisee; as to zeal, a persecutor of the church; as to righteousness under the law, blameless. Yet whatever gains I had, these I have come to regard as loss because of Christ. More than that, I regard everything as loss because of the surpassing value of knowing Christ Jesus my Lord. For his sake I have suffered the loss of all things, and I regard them as rubbish, in order that I may gain Christ and be found in him, not having a righteousness of my own that comes from the law, but one that comes through faith in Christ, the righteousness from God based on faith. I want to know Christ and the power of his resurrection and the sharing of his sufferings by becoming like him in his death, if somehow I may attain the resurrection from the dead. Not that I have already obtained this or have already reached the goal; but I press on to make it my own, because Christ Jesus has made me his own. Beloved, I do not consider that I have made it my own; but this one thing I do: forgetting what lies behind and straining forward to what lies ahead, I press on toward the goal for the prize of the heavenly call of God in Christ Jesus.

Priest: **The Holy Gospel of our Lord Jesus Christ according to St. Matthew 21:33-46** - Jesus said, "Listen to another parable. There was a landowner who planted a vineyard, put a fence around it, dug a wine press in it, and built a watchtower. Then he leased it to tenants and went to another country. When the harvest time had come, he sent his slaves to the tenants to collect his produce. But the tenants seized his slaves and beat one, killed another, and stoned another. Again he sent other slaves, more than the first; and they treated them in the same way. Finally he sent his son to them, saying, 'They will respect my son.' But when the tenants saw the son, they said to themselves, 'This is the heir; come, let us kill him and get his inheritance.' So they seized him, threw him out of the

vineyard, and killed him. Now when the owner of the vineyard comes, what will he do to those tenants?" They said to him, "He will put those wretches to a miserable death, and lease the vineyard to other tenants who will give him the produce at the harvest time." Jesus said to them, "Have you never read in the scriptures: 'The stone that the builders rejected has become the cornerstone; this was the Lord's doing, and it is amazing in our eyes'? Therefore I tell you, the kingdom of God will be taken away from you and given to a people that produces the fruits of the kingdom. The one who falls on this stone will be broken to pieces; and it will crush anyone on whom it falls." When the chief priests and the Pharisees heard his parables, they realized that he was speaking about them. They wanted to arrest him, but they feared the crowds, because they regarded him as a prophet.

From the Green Team

“In front of the throne is something like a sea of glass, like crystal.” (Revelation 4:6)

Glass was already known during antiquity, but plastic has pretty much taken its place for all our containers. Plastic is a product of the petrochemical industry and is less recyclable than glass, since it degrades during the recycling process. But glass, since is infinitely recyclable and comes from an inexhaustible source. Let's be honest: we're never going to run out of sand!

Try to buy glass containers when possible when you're shopping for jam, peanut butter or ketchup, for example. Some small dairy producers offer milk and cream in returnable bottles. An old idea that's new gain!

Please contact the Office to let us know if you will be coming to any of the services listed above. You may use the phone number or email address as noted at the bottom of this page. Please contact the church before 2:30pm the Friday before any Sunday service. A spot will then be reserved for you. For Sunday services, you have until 9:25am to get seated. At that time, available spots will be assigned to those who did not pre-book. This last minute seating will be done on a first come first serve basis.

A list of the names and phone numbers will be forwarded to the Wardens, Father Doug prior to each service. These names will be checked at the services by the sides people on duty. This information is necessary for contact tracing.

An offertory plate will be available at the entrance for donations and envelopes.

Parishioners must wear masks and a few will be available at each service to be worn during the service and then taken home.

A large hand sanitizer dispenser will be placed at the entrance for parishioners' use.

The Order of Service will be displayed on the television screens. No leaflets will be available at the services. However, announcements and related Parish information will be posted on the Church website and included in weekly All Saints' Alive newsletters.

The library, Parish Hall, Upstairs Washrooms, Kitchen will all be out of bounds during Worship Services.

The reopening of the church on Sundays and Wednesdays will be for Worship Services only. At no other times during the week in September will parishioners or the public be permitted in the church building.

At this stage of opening we are sadly still unable to accept flower donations for the altar. If you had made prior arrangements for dates in the future you should now have been contacted by the flower co-ordinators, Donna Hurst or Rhuna Sandell.

In the meantime we would like to make a recommendation using an enhanced example that was set by one of our dear parishioners.

- In lieu of flowers, you may consider making a donation to the church.
- A slide will be then be prepared and inserted as a part of the service for the screens in the church and for viewers at home.
- This screen will acknowledge you by name as well as the person you are donating in memory of, or otherwise honouring.
- Your donation will also be noted in the on-line bulletin.
- The donation in lieu of flowers will also be cited by the intercessor on duty during the prayers of the people.
- Of course you may choose to donate but opt to not be acknowledged; however, we truly hope that you do not choose to do this.

This solution represents a beautiful idea for loved ones, does not require florists be given access to the church, nor the required follow-up sanitizing nor the dealing with flowers and vases after the service. Father Doug, the Wardens, the Altar Guild and the flower co-ordinators hope that everyone can embrace this new procedure.
