## **The Proclamation of the Word**

### **First Reading**

**Leviticus 19:9-18** - When you reap the harvest of your land, you shall not reap to the very edges of your field, or gather the gleanings of your harvest. You shall not strip your vineyard bare, or gather the fallen grapes of your vineyard; you shall leave them for the poor and the alien: I am the Lord your God. You shall not steal; you shall not deal falsely; and you shall not lie to one another. And you shall not swear falsely by my name, profaning the name of your God: I am the Lord. You shall not defraud your neighbour; you shall not steal; and you shall not keep for yourself the wages of a labourer until morning. You shall not revile the deaf or put a stumbling-block before the blind; you shall fear your God: I am the

Lord. You shall not render an unjust judgement; you shall not be partial to the poor or defer to the great: with justice you shall judge your neighbour. You shall not go around as a slanderer among your people, and you shall not profit by the blood of your neighbour: I am the Lord. You shall not hate in your heart anyone of your kin; you shall reprove your neighbour, or you will incur guilt yourself. You shall not take vengeance or bear a grudge against any of your people, but you shall love your neighbour as yourself: I am the Lord.

### **Psalm 148**

Praise the Lord! Praise the Lord from the heavens; praise him in the heights! Praise him, all his angels; praise him, all his host! Praise him, sun and moon; praise him, all you shining stars! ### **Second Reading**

**Philippians 2:1-13** - If then there is any encouragement in Christ, any consolation from love, any sharing in the Spirit, any compassion and sympathy, make my joy complete: be of the same mind, having the same love, being in full accord and of one mind. Do nothing from selfish ambition or conceit, but in humility regard others as better than yourselves. Let each of you look not to your own interests, but to the interests of others. Let the same mind be in you that was in Christ Jesus, who, though he was in the form of God, did not regard equality with God as something to be exploited, but emptied himself, taking the form of a slave, being born in human likeness. And being found in human form, he humbled himself and became obedient to the point of death - even death on a cross. Therefore God also highly exalted him and gave him the name that is above every name, so that at the name of Jesus every knee should bend, in heaven and on earth and under the earth, and every tongue should

confess that Jesus Christ is Lord, to the glory of God the Father. Therefore, my beloved, just as you have always obeyed me, not only in my presence, but much more now in my absence, work out your own salvation with fear and trembling; for it is God who is at work in you, enabling you both to will and to work for his good pleasure.

## **From the Green Team**

**“...all their host shall fall down, as the leaf falleth off from the vine, and as a falling [fig] from the fig tree.”** (Isaiah 34:4)

It's part of the cycle of nature: after giving us shade throughout the summer, leaves fall in autumn. Leaves are a gift that fall from the sky and are precious. Here are some things you can do with them:

- run over them with your lawn mower to feed your lawn;
- save them for your compost;
- put your leaf bags out for pickup by your city to be turned into compost.

These actions help reduce the greenhouse gases generated by organic material decomposing in landfills. In other words, this is changing the world, one leaf at a time!

A large hand sanitizer dispenser will be placed at the entrance for parishioners' use.

The Order of Service will be displayed on the television screens. No leaflets will be available at the services. However, announcements and related Parish information will be posted on the Church website and included in weekly All Saints' Alive newsletters.

The library, Parish Hall, Upstairs Washrooms, Kitchen will all be out of bounds during Worship Services.

The reopening of the church on Sundays and Wednesdays will be for Worship Services only. At no other times during the week in September will parishioners or the public be permitted in the church building.

## **Flower Donations to All Saints' Anglican Church, Collingwood Diocese of Toronto Amber Stage of Opening September 13/2020**

At this stage of opening we are sadly still unable to accept flower donations for the altar. If you had made prior arrangements for dates in the future you should now have been contacted by the flower co-ordinators, Donna Hurst or Rhuna Sandell.

In the meantime we would like to make a recommendation using an enhanced example that was set by one of our dear parishioners.

- In lieu of flowers, you may consider making a donation to the church.
- A slide will be then be prepared and inserted as a part of the service for the screens in the church and for viewers at home.
- This screen will acknowledge you by name as well as the person you are donating in memory of, or otherwise honouring.
- Your donation will also be noted in the on-line bulletin.
- The donation in lieu of flowers will also be cited by the intercessor on duty during the prayers of the people.
- Of course you may choose to donate but opt to not be acknowledged; however, we truly hope that you do not choose to do this.

This solution represents a beautiful idea for loved ones, does not require florists be given access to the church, nor the required follow-up sanitizing nor the dealing with flowers and vases after the service. Father Doug, the Wardens, the Altar Guild and the flower co-ordinators hope that everyone can embrace this new procedure.
