## **From the Green Team**

**How can I make my home more energy-efficient?**

**Make small changes that add up**

**Living room, dining room and office**

Buy ENERGY STAR certified recessed lighting fixtures (pot lights): use up to 90% less energy than traditional models with incandescent bulbs

- 2) Starting this Sunday, we will return to our practice of reading the gospel from the middle of the congregation. If you're wondering why we do this (a perfectly good question!), here's the explanation from [www.anglican.ca](http://www.anglican.ca) :

*In the early church scripture was read at every eucharist and the commonest pattern was to have three readings: 1) one from the Old Testament; 2) one from the New Testament epistles or Acts or Revelation; and 3) one from the Gospels. "The reading of the gospel is the last of the scripture readings and the climax of the series. In it is seen the presence of Christ the Word of God. Hence great honour is often accorded to the gospel book. .... The book is frequently carried in procession to the place of reading, accompanied by lights [i.e. candles] and incense. Traditionally it was read from a pulpit of ambo, but often today in the middle of the congregation". [See section "Readings, Eucharistic" in *The New Westminster Dictionary of Liturgy and Worship*.
